

2021 High Roller Reining Classic Terms & Conditions

STABLING

It is a possibility that stalls WILL SELL OUT. With this being the case, event sponsors will have priority to receive stalls, after that stalls are on a first-come-first-serve basis. Once stalls are full, a wait list will be started. There is no guarantee of available stalls. Stalls are permanent 10' x 10' and barns are climate controlled, include mats and 6 bags of white pine shavings in EVERY stall. Stall payments must be submitted online to the Stall Manager. No stall payments will go on show bills! The stalls at the South Point Event and Equestrian Center are treated with SynBioNT, www.synbiontagwash.com, after every equestrian event for the protection of your horses and for your peace of mind. Stalls will be available starting at 8:00AM Wednesday, September 8 and are based on availability. **ALL STALLS MUST BE ORDERED ONLINE.** There are no Haul-Ins allowed! All horses attending the event must have a stall. **No stall refunds after August 15. LATE FEE OF \$25 PER STALL WILL BE APPLIED TO ALL STALL RESERVATIONS MADE AFTER 8/1/2021. MOVE IN BEGINS WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8 | 8:00AM.** Move out is required by Sunday, September 19 at 10:00AM. NO OUTSIDE BEDDING is permitted on the grounds. At the competition of the event, any show credits will be issued a reimbursement check within 45 days. The South Point Event and Equestrian Center restricts the use of refrigerators in horse stalls. South Point Equestrian Center Rules/Fire Marshall Regulations specify that at no time should there be feed, bedding, tack, and/or grooming items stored in stall aisles. **All these items MUST be stored in stalls.** THESE IS A FIRE MARSHALL REGULATIONS AND ARE SUBJECT TO FINES IMPOSED BY SUCH! \$100 FINE PER OCCURENCE. **TRAINERS – YOU ARE ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYING FOR STALLS ORDERED IN YOUR GROUP! PLEASE COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR CUSTOMERS TO AVOID DUPLICATE STALL ORDERS.**

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

No outside video or photography is allowed. Competitors are encouraged to purchase videos and photos from the official show videographer and images from the official photographer. By way of entry into the event, competitors, and their respective employees, agents and family members grant the permission without remuneration for the use and public distribution of their image, likeness, voice and video for the possible promotion of the event. All exhibitors will be subject to the use of photographers and videographers under the direction of show management for the benefit of show promotion. No exhibitor will be allowed the discretionary use of his or her services. **ONLY THE OFFICIAL EVENT PHOTOGRAPHER WILL BE ALLOWED TO SELL PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE HIGH ROLLER REINING CLASSIC HORSE SHOW.** All images pertaining to or in relation to the High Roller Reining Classic Horse Show are under the sole ownership of HRRRC, Inc. Only event management approved reporters assigned by recognized newspapers, radio or television or the Associated Press will be issued press passes. Requests for press passes **MUST** be sent in writing e-mailed to brumleyevents@gmail.com, on the letterhead of the newspaper, magazine or broadcast outlet and signed by the editor. All other photographers must sign an agreement not to sell their photographs except to the publications for which they work two weeks prior to the beginning of the show. Photographers who have not followed these requirements will be escorted off the grounds.

DAMAGE

Individuals will be responsible for any physical damage inflicted to the South Point Event and Equestrian Center property and will reimburse the show management for such damage as it may be charged. All owners and exhibitors shall be responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings, and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. **CLEAN UP FEE: A FEE OF \$250 WILL BE CHARGED TO ALL EXHIBITORS WHO LEAVE BEHIND STALL DECORATING MATERIALS SUCH AS WOOD, WIRE, BARK, FLOWERS, ETC.** *Stalls must be left as you found them!*

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS & CERTIFICATES

Health requirements for the State of Nevada and the South Point Event and Equestrian Center will be followed. A 30-day health certificate and 6-month Coggins are required upon arrival. This includes horses that reside in the state of Nevada.

LIABILITY

By participating in the High Roller Reining Classic, all competitors agree to abide by the rules of the show and the governing body NRHA. In addition, acknowledge that horses are dangerous animals and can be hazardous. By participating in the competition with this knowledge of the danger involved the competitor agrees to accept any and all risks of injury or death.

RULES/CHANGES

The High Roller Reining Classic, Inc. and Brumley Management Group Inc, reserve the right to make additions or changes to this event at any time. Show management has the authority to enforce all rules referring to the show and may excuse any horse or exhibitor from the show prior to, during or after the judging without refunds. **SHOW MANAGEMENT RESERVES TO ITSELF THE RIGHT TO REFUSE, ACCEPT CONDITIONALLY, OR TO CANCEL ANY ENTRIES, DISQUALIFY ANY RIDERS OR EXHIBITORS, PROHIBIT EXHIBITION OF ENTRIES AND CANCEL AWARD PRIZES, WITHOUT CLAIM OF DAMAGES.** The show management reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations. All decisions are final. By way of making an entry, the exhibitor is assuming responsibility for knowledge of the rules and releases show management from any claims or losses. The show management reserves the right to modify or change conditions for the High Roller Reining Classic event at any time. All decisions of the judges are final.

RIGHT TO CANCEL

The show management reserves the right to cancel the event without notice at any time prior to the contest and without liability to the show management. In the event of such cancellation, entry fees or other show fees paid in advance shall be refunded. The show management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by show management, its decision to be final. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under control of the show management, but the show management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, officials, employees, Directors, Sponsors and the South Point Event and Equestrian Center blameless for any loss or accident to horse(s), employees or equipment.

SECURITY AND PARKING

The South Point Event and Equestrian Center provide monitored security in all areas of the Event Center, Casino, and Hotel. Access to the equine stabling and warm up areas is restricted to those individuals who participate in the event and are provided High Roller Reining Classic Barn Access Passes. **These passes must be worn at all times to enter these areas.** Night time access to the barns is limited. South Point Security must be notified to gain vehicle access to the stabling areas with a vehicle after event hours. The South Point Event and Equestrian Center has designated specific areas to park trucks and trailers. It is required that all trailers be parked in designated parking areas only.

BEHAVIOR, CONDUCT AND ANIMAL WELFARE

Any action of disrespect, deceit, or fraud directed to show management, grounds crew, show representatives or judges will result in disqualification from competition and removal from the facility. No fees, entry or stall refunds will be provided. Individuals accused of unsportsmanlike conduct will be subject to the disciplinary procedures set forth by the National Reining Horse Association in Article A of the handbook and will be suspended from BMG Events for a term determined by show management. NO ABUSE TO ANY ANIMAL WILL BE TOLERATED. Stabling and arenas will be monitored 24 hours a day. Anyone found to be abusing animals will be disqualified and reported to NRHA.

Competition guidelines for exhibitor schooling:

Every competition class offered at this event is broadcast LIVE over the internet to the WORLD. In an effort to maintain the integrity and professional appearance of the event, all exhibitors choosing to enter COMPETITION CLASSES to school horses, **MUST** present these horses in show attire. Show attire is defined as; exhibitor's entry is required to present their horse with a show pad, clean tack, and the horse's tail must be down (not braided or up in a tail bag/sock). It is requested by show management that the rider wear show chaps. As per NRHA Attire Guidelines, a long sleeve shirt, western hat and boots are required. The Equipment Judge located at the back gate of the show arena will enforce this guideline.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

OPEN SHOW TABS: Will be held in the show office. An open check or credit card number for each horse entered will be required to pick up competitor numbers. Checks not closed out within one hour after the end of the last class of the event will be closed out according to the responsible party's account and will incur a \$15 service fee. **Trainers will ultimately be responsible for all client fees not paid at the close of show and therefore will be applied to trainer's show bill.**

DIVISION ADDS: In the case of multiple divisions running concurrently, once the draw is posted no divisions may be added. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to confirm divisions entered prior to the draw taking place. In the case of an office error, division will be added prior to the start of the competition. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to notify the show office prior to the start of the competition if the divisions listed are incorrect or missing. Once competition has started no changes will be made.

ANCILLARY: For horses of any age as of the start of the calendar year. See NRHA rule book for division requirements.

FUTURITY: For horses three years of age as of the start of the calendar year. **Level 3 eligible exhibitors do NOT have to enter Level 4 divisions.**

WILD CARD: For horses four years of age as of the start of the calendar year with eligibility requirements. **Level 2 eligible exhibitors do NOT have to enter Level 4 divisions.**

STAKES: For horses four years of age as of the start of the calendar year. **Level 2 eligible exhibitors do NOT have to enter Level 4 divisions.**

DERBY: For horses four, five, six and seven years of age as of the start of the calendar year. **Level 3 eligible exhibitors do NOT have to enter Level 4 divisions.**

MATURITY: For horses seven years of age or older as of the start of the calendar year.

DIVISION ENTRIES: (Must be received by August 1)

Submission of completed Entry Form, one per horse, NRHA Competition License and Owner/Rider current NRHA Membership cards, and signed Participation Liability Release must be RECEIVED by August 1ST, for entry to be considered complete. **A form of payment will be required to check in and receive your number at the show office. DO NOT MAIL ENTRIES IF THEY WILL BE RECEIVED BY SHOW MANAGEMENT AFTER AUGUST 20!** Email: brumleyevents@gmail.com Fax: 623-670-5905 **NO REFUNDS ONCE THE CLASS DRAW HAS BEEN POSTED.**

MATURITY AND ANCILLARY DIVISIONS

PRE-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Submission of completed Entry Form, one per horse, NRHA Competition License and Owner/Rider current NRHA Membership cards, signed Participation Liability Release, and form of payment must be RECEIVED by August 1, for entry to be considered complete and avoid the \$85 late fee assessment. For entries that are emailed, there must be HRRC Credit Card Authorization Form included to at least hold the entry. If holding with a credit card, please write HOLD by the credit card info and mail a check immediately. Post entries will be accepted until 1:00pm the day BEFORE the class is to take place. An ADD Card must be filled out in the show office for all added classes prior to deadline. A SCRATCH Card must be filled out in the show office for all scratched classes. **NO CHANGES WILL BE TAKEN AT THE BACK GATE.**

WILD CARD and THE STAKES CLUB DIVISIONS:

PRE-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Submission of completed Entry Form, one per horse, NRHA Competition License and Owner/Rider current NRHA Membership cards, signed Participation Liability Release, and form of payment must be RECEIVED by August 1, for entry to be considered complete and avoid the \$200 late fee assessment. For entries that are emailed, there must be HRRC Credit Card Authorization Form included to at least hold the entry. If holding with a credit card, please write HOLD by the credit card info and mail a check immediately. Post entries will be accepted until 1:00pm the day BEFORE the class is to take place. An ADD Card must be filled out in the show office for all added classes prior to deadline. A SCRATCH Card must be filled out in the show office for all scratched classes. **NO CHANGES WILL BE TAKEN AT THE BACK GATE. Level 2 eligible exhibitors do NOT have to enter Level 4 divisions.**

FUTURITY and DERBY DIVISIONS:

PRE-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Submission of completed Entry Form, one per horse, NRHA Competition License and Owner/Rider current NRHA Membership cards, signed Participation Liability Release, and form of payment must be RECEIVED by August 1, for entry to be considered complete and avoid the \$200 late fee assessment. For entries that are emailed, there must be HRRC Credit Card Authorization Form included to at least hold the entry. If holding with a credit card, please write HOLD by the credit card info and mail a check immediately. Post entries will be accepted until 1:00pm the day BEFORE the class is to take place. An ADD Card must be filled out in the show office for all added classes prior to deadline. A SCRATCH Card must be filled out in the show office for all scratched classes. **NO CHANGES WILL BE TAKEN AT THE BACK GATE. Exhibitors are required to enter up a minimum of one level, excluding Open & Non Pro Level 1, 2, 3 exhibitors are not required to enter Level 4. Amateur Division must cross enter into Derby level 1, 2, 3 or 4. Prime Time and Masters do not have to enter additional levels.**

CLEARIFICATION: THE STAKES CLUB \$100,000 Added Level 4 Open, with 0% show retainage, will run Friday, September 17. Those Exhibitors who choose to cross enter into the Level 2 Stakes or any Derby divisions will compete in this slate on Friday. This score will be the score for the other Aged divisions. You will NOT have to run your horses two times in order to compete in the Derby divisions!

AMATEUR DERBY DIVISION ELIGIBILITY*: For horses four, five, six and seven years of age as of the start of the calendar year.

The criteria are as follows:

- To compete in the Amateur division, the same horse/rider must be cross-entered into a minimum of one Level of Non Pro Derby, Level 1, 2, 3 or 4.
- Riders entering the Amateur division must be Non Pros as defined in the NRHA Handbook.
- Riders must abide by the non pro ownership rules as outlined in the NRHA Handbook.
- All other NRHA rules apply.

The following riders are **EXCLUDED** from competing in the Amateur division:

- Youth (as defined by the youth membership requirements in the NRHA Handbook)
- Level 4 Non Pro division only exhibitors
- Anyone who has exceeded NRHA lifetime earnings of \$100,000 in Category 2, 6, and 8 as of 12/31/20
- A "professional equine trainer" is defined as someone who handles the mounted preparation of a horse with the intent to improve the horse's performance in any equine discipline (as defined in the NRHA Handbook).
- Individuals who previously held a NRHA Professional Open card and no longer does so.
- Individual who is directly related to a professional equine trainer; husband, wife, son, daughter
- Legal dependents of professional equine trainers.
 - A legal dependent is defined as being officially claimed as a dependent on a tax return, i.e. adopted child, foster child, or legal guardianship.
- Spouses or legal partners/mates of professional equine trainers.
 - Partner/mate status will only be accepted when the civil status is legally and lawfully registered in the country/state of residence. All relationships must be current and lawful.
 - NRHA judges and breeders are eligible to compete in the amateur division if they meet the required criteria listed above.

ARABIAN FUTURITIES: For Arabian and Half Arabian horses ages four or five years of age as of the start of the calendar year. Horses may be shown one handed in a shank bridle or two handed in a snaffle or hackamore. Prize money will be split as follows 50% show retainage, 50% added back to purse. NRHA payback Schedule B percentages utilized and will be based on the number of eligible entrants in each division.

WILD CARD 4 YEAR OLD REINING CHALLENGE ELIGIBILITY

The 4 Year Old Wild Card has been created to offer young horses more time to receive the training they need to start their competition careers. **With this goal in mind, to be eligible to compete in the Wild Card 4 Year Old, horses must be 4 years of age as of the start of the calendar year and cannot have earned more than \$5,000 in NRHA Lifetime Earnings All Categories prior to January 1, 2021.** These horses are allowed to have been shown in NRHA Futurities and/or Derby and Stakes divisions. Post entries will be accepted until 1:00pm the day BEFORE the class is to take place with late fee. An ADD Card must be filled out in the show office for all added classes prior to deadline. A SCRATCH Card must be filled out in the show office for all scratched classes. NO CHANGES WILL BE TAKEN AT THE BACK GATE.

AGED EVENTS – 4/5/6/7 YEAR OLD DERBY, 4 YEAR OLD STAKES, 4 YEAR OLD WILD CARD & 3 YEAR OLD FUTURITY

MAY BE SHOW ONE HANDED IN A SHANK BRIDLE OR TWO HANDED IN A SNAFFLE BIT OR HACKAMORE.

FEES

Each horse entered in the event will be assessed a one-time Administration Fee of \$85, a Video Fee of \$25, and Photo Fee of \$25. Exhibitors who do not check out their accounts prior to their departure will be charge a one-time fee of \$15 to close out their open check or credit card and mail receipt statement. A 3.5% convenience fee will be added to all credit card charges.

REFUNDS AND CANCELATIONS

After August 15th, cancelation of an Aged Event Entry will receive a refund of entry fees with submission of veterinary certificate stating the horse is unable to compete due to health reasons. Horses may be substituted, based on management's discretion. Ancillary divisions will receive a refund of their entries if the divisions are scratched prior to the draw taking place. Refunds for stalls and/or entries will be issued a reimbursement check within 45 days after the event. Stalls must be canceled by the cut off deadline in order to receive a refund. NO EXCEPTIONS. The Administration Fee of \$85.00 is non-refundable.

AGED EVENT RETAINAGE – 4/5/6/7 YEAR OLD DERBY, 4 YEAR OLD WILD CARD & 3 YEAR OLD FUTURITY

NRHA requires 5% of total entry fees made payable to them. After the NRHA 5% has been deducted from the total prize money, the remaining prize money will be split as follows 50% show retainage, 50% added back to purse. NRHA payback Schedule B percentages utilized and will be based on the number of eligible entrants in each division.

AGED EVENT RETAINAGE – THE STAKES CLUB - 4 YEAR OLD

NRHA requires 5% of total entry fees made payable to them. After the NRHA 5% has been deducted from the total prize money, the remaining prize money will be split as follows 0% show retainage, 100% added back to purse. NRHA payback Schedule A percentages utilized and will be based on the number of eligible entrants in each division.

MATURITY DIVISIONS: NRHA requires 5% of total entry fees made payable to them. After the NRHA 5% has been deducted from the total prize money, the remaining prize money will be split as follows 50% show retainage, 50% added back to purse. NRHA payback Schedule A percentages utilized and will be based on the number of eligible entrants in each division.

ANCILLARY DIVISIONS: NRHA requires 5% of total entry fees made payable to them. After the NRHA 5% has been deducted from the total prize money, the remaining prize money will be split as follows 50% show retainage, 50% added back to purse. NRHA payback Schedule A percentages utilized and will be based on the number of eligible entrants in each division.

ARABIAN FUTURITIES: For Arabian and Half Arabian horses ages four or five years of age as of the start of the calendar year. Horses may be shown one handed in a shank bridle or two handed in a snaffle or hackamore. Prize money will be split as follows 50% show retainage, 50% added back to purse. NRHA payback Schedule B percentages utilized and will be based on the number of eligible entrants in each division.

HIGH POINT TROPHY SADDLES: In the instance where there is a tie for Champion in multiple High Point Divisions with saddles, for example Rookie 1, 2 and Prime Time Rookie, saddles will be divided between winners equally instead of flipping a coin. This allows for tied parties to receive a trophy saddle. If there are more than two exhibitors tied to win High Point Saddles, management will decide a fair way to break the tie.

AWARDS

Exhibitors are responsible for picking up their awards at the event. Awards not picked up at the event will not be shipped. If the exhibitor contacts Brumley Management Group in writing requesting items to be shipped, cost of shipping and a \$25 service fee will must be paid by exhibitor prior to shipping.

AWARD PAYOUT CHECKS will be mailed once management receives NRHA approval of results. If NRHA does not return approved results to show management within 40 days after the last day of the event, checks will be mailed out to abide by NRHA's 45 day payout rule requirement. If checks are mailed out prior to show management receiving NRHA result approval, HRRRC, Inc. and Brumley Management Group, LLC will not be held liable for any prize money or awards not returned to show management by those who are disqualified by NRHA. Those who fail to provide payment for outstanding invoices or return disqualified prize money within 10 days of being notified will be **SUSPENDED** from any further Brumley Management Group, LLC events and reported to the NRHA for disciplinary procedures. Any outstanding balances owed will be deducted from payouts. Returned checks will be charge a \$50 NSF Fee. Remaining balances will have 10 days to provide payment in full via cashier's check or credit card (including credit card fee of 5%). Payments not received within the designated time may incur penalty fees.

AGED EVENT DRAWS (DERBY, FUTURITY, STAKES, & WILD CARD)

All Aged Event Division draws will be public. Exhibitors are expected to attend and draw for their show positions or send a representative. If no one is in attendance, management will draw for their position. Exhibitors with multiple entries will draw first, followed alphabetically by horse names. NRHA rules state that a minimum of eight horses is required between exhibitors.

DRAGS: ALL Aged Event competition will have a drag after every six (6) horses in the draw. The drag **WILL NOT** be moved due to scratches.
